ABOUT THE AUTHOR

Sir Terence David John Pratchett OBE (28 April 1948 — 12 March 2015) was an English author, humorist, and satirist, best known for the Discworld series of 41 comic fantasy novels published between 1983 and 2015, and for the apocalyptic comedy novel Good Omens (1990), which he co-wrote with Neil Gaiman.

Pratchett's first novel, The Carpet People, was published in 1971. The first Discworld novel, The Colour of Magic, was published in 1983, after which Pratchett wrote an average of two books a year. The final Discworld novel, The Shepherd's Crown, was published in August 2015, five months after his death.

With more than 100 million books sold worldwide in 43 languages, Pratchett was the UK's best-selling author of the 1990s. He was appointed an Officer of the Order of the British Empire (OBE) in 1998 and was knighted for services to literature in the 2009 New Year Honours. In 2001, he won the annual Carnegie Medal for The Amazing Maurice and His Educated Rodents, the first Discworld book marketed for children. He received the World Fantasy Award for Life Achievement in 2010.

In December 2007 Pratchett announced that he had been diagnosed with early-onset Alzheimer's disease. He later made a substantial public donation to the Alzheimer's Research Trust (now Alzheimer's Research UK, ARUK), filmed three television programmes chronicling his experiences with the condition for the BBC, and became a patron of ARUK. Pratchett died on 12 March 2015, at the age of 66.



TULIN UDUL

As a classically Trained actor in BA (hons) Acting Harriet specialities in



Meisner Technique, physical comedy and clowning. Even though recently going into the film making industry, acting in theatre's and the Archway theatre and company always feels like home and says nothing beats telling a story to live audiences.



TONY GODDEN

Tony has plodded through the grind of playing the works of Shakespeare, Dickens and various modern authors. When the Hogfather came on the horizon, he recognized the special challenge that Pratchett's work presents.

To that end after putting in a bit of research, he immersed himself in the culture of some of the most disreputable drinking establishments in the country. He found a new perspective lying face down in recycled lamb biryani after being robbed, got stuck miles from civilisation when missing the last train, slept on a frosty park bench etc..

Having generally congratulated himself that he was such a dedicated actor for sticking with the project, he hopes the show's audience appreciates the effort put in and the lengths a true artist might go to to amuse them.



GARY ANDREWS

Gary is very happy to be back on Discworld and once again sticking on the Albert nose (first worn back in 2019 in 'Mort').

This is the third Pratchett he has directed, following in the wake of 'Wyrd Sisters' and 'Lords and Ladies'. He is a huge fan of Discworld and was even lucky enough to work on the animated films many moons ago, animating Death voiced by Christopher Lee.

Next year, he will be directing our open air production of 'The Wind in the Willows' in Tilgate and our December production of 'A Christmas Carol' in the Main House.

MATT DONALD

Matt has been a Member for over 4 years. He's been in a smattering of shows although this is his first attempt at Death. As well as a mask he gets to wear slippers in this role so on the whole he is rather pleased





JOSH PANNELL

Josh has been in a few plays at the Archway but he is really looking forward to playing the role of Gawain in 'Hogfather' as it's his first studio production. Josh has really enjoyed working with such a fantastic and funny crew and directors.



TOM HOWLAND

Tom is an American born, naturalized Swede and Brit and has been a member of the Archway Theatre for 8 years now. He always enjoys the wide variety of productions the company produces. This is his second production in the Studio, but not his first brush with Pratchett, having appeared in 'Wyrd Sisters' in the Mian House.

This is Matthew's second Archway show, and his second dive into the world of Pratchett, having played the Elf King in 'Lords and Ladies'.



THE DISCWORLD



The Discworld flies through space on the backs of four elephants, in turn standing upon the shell of the immense star turtle, Great A'Tuin. But it's much more than that. Not far under the fantasy trappings lives a rich world filled with deeply human characters, razor-sharp insight and Terry's crackling, often furious, wisdom. It's also one of the world's bestselling literary creations, read by millions worldwide

The Discworld novels contain common themes and motifs that run through the series. Many of the novels parody fantasy tropes and various subgenres of fantasy, like fairy tales (notably Witches Abroad) or vampire tales (Carpe Jugulum). Analogies of real-world issues, such as religion (Small Gods), fundamentalism and inner city tension (Thud), business and politics (Making Money), racial prejudice and exploitation (Snuff) recur, as do aspects of culture and entertainment such as opera (Maskerade), rock music (Soul Music), cinema (Moving Pictures), and football (Unseen Academicals). Parodies of non-Discworld fiction also occur frequently, including Shakespeare, Beatrix Potter, and several movies. Major historical events, especially battles, are sometimes the basis for both trivial and key events (Jingo, Eric, and Pyramids), as are trends in science, technology, pop culture and modern art (Moving Pictures, Men at Arms, Thud). There are also humanist themes in many Discworld novels, and a focus on critical thinking skills in the Witches and Tiffany Aching series.

DISCWORLD AT THE ARCHWAY

Hogfather is the Fifth Discworld play to be presented at the Archway. The Youth Workshop have performed The Amazing Maurice and his Educated Rodents (twice, so technically this is the 6th show I suppose!), which is one of Pratchett's Discworld 'spin-offs' that don't feature any of the usual characters.

The first of the main canon we performed was 'Mort', here in the Studio back in 2019, directed by Dodie (who co-directs Hogfather), a story of Death taking on an apprentice.

This was followed by the plays centered around the 3 witches (Granny Weatherwax, Nanny Ogg and Magrat Garlick): 'Wyrd Sisters' in the Main House and 'Lords and Ladies' here in the Studio and were directed by Gary (co-directing tonight with Dodie).

I felt it was only fair that the witches, sorely missing from Hogfather, got a look in, so we adapted the character of the Narrator to be played by Tulin, reprising her wonderful Nanny Ogg.

The Discworld is an alternate world that although resembling our own, is not set in any one particular time. Indeed, with each new book, the overall period slowly evolved. What began as pretty much classic sword and sorcery/medieval setting ended up almost parallel to the Victorian era. We have reflected this in the costuming, with a mixture of periods and styles that are character, rather than time-period based. We have also used a soundscape in place of a set, mainly due to the limitations of the studio setting, relying on the audience imagination to provide the 'pictures'.

Club policies

- No cameras, videos, recorders or mobile phones: The use of cameras, video cameras, audio recorders and mobile phones in the Auditorium is not allowed. Please make sure that mobile phones are switched off during the performance. We would also remind you that the sound of coughing, rustling paper, talking and the beep of digital watches may distract the actors and your fellow audience members.
- Late admission to the Auditorium is only possible if there is an appropriate break in the performance. The House Manager will let you know.
- No smoking: Smoking is illegal anywhere in the theatre. There is a designated smoking area outside the theatre entrance beyond the yellow line. For clarification please speak to one of the Front of House managers.
- Interval drinks: The Bar Staff will appreciate receiving your orders for interval drinks before the performance starts. Pre-ordered drinks will be available near the stairs at the start of the interval. Ice creams can be purchased from Front of House staff in the interval but they are not permitted in the Auditorium. Food and drinks are not permitted in the Auditorium.
- Bar service: Patrons are respectfully reminded that licensing laws do not allow us to serve under 16s at the bar. We would therefore ask for your co-operation that only adults purchase from the bar. Where this is unavoidable we have a designated area for use by under 18 year olds. Please do not take offence if we ask youngsters to move away from the immediate bar area.

Staffing

Volunteers: Our theatre is staffed by volunteers. On a performance night, the Box office, Front of House, Bar and Coffee are all run by volunteers. If you would like to become a volunteer please speak to the Front of House staff.

- Online bookings visit www.archwaytheatre.co.uk. Tickets for all of our productions in the Main House and the Studio can now be booked online 24 hours a day. You will be able to view our seating plan and pick your seats from those available
- Box Office: Tickets can still be purchased on performance nights by visiting the Box Office from 7pm (subject to availability).
- Personal bookings: The theatre will be open on Saturday mornings between 10.30am and 11.30am for us to take your booking for you there and then.
- Facebook bookings: visit us at facebook.com/Archway Theatre and click Buy Tickets logo at the top.
- Permanent bookings: In November we offer our club members the opportunity of booking seats for the forthcoming (excluding pantomime) nine productions during the following year.

This allows you to book the same seats, on the same evening, for each play, and payment can be made singly or by instalments. Permanent bookers don't need to do anything with online bookings, it is all done for you.
